Infrastructure Week

"...Many communities are making the right choices. State and local leaders are raising revenue, attracting investors, and delivering projects that communities need to thrive. The number of structurally deficient bridges is finally shrinking as thousands are repaired. Many drinking water utilities are modernizing their water treatment and delivery systems, while wastewater utilities are investing in technologies to reduce costs and use less energy. Companies and cities are deploying new communications technologies with transformative implications for transportation, healthcare, and agriculture starts, deferred maintenance, and industries. Rideshare, bicycles, scooters, and other mobility solutions are working with public transit to ease congestion and solve

"last mile" challenges for suburban, rural, and handicapped residents.

But will large-scale action by the federal government to provide both a national vision for infrastructure and significant funding to support it? We still have a long way to go. Regional projects with implications for the national economy aren't getting the funding they need. And state and local projects that depend, even partly, on federal funding, loans, permitting, and new regulatory action, aren't breaking ground. False starts, delayed inadequate levels of investment are putting our infrastructure, our health and safety, and our economy at risk.

Cities, counties, states, and the private sector are working hard, but need a strong, reliable federal partner to get the job done. The choice is clear: with political courage, hard work, smart policy, and strong investment, we can give Americans the future they deserve. We can make our communities stronger, grow our economy, and improve our quality of life, but we need sound, ambitious, and steady infrastructure policy and investment – and we can only do it with a strong federal partner."
