Alabama AFL-CIO Convention







Last month delegates from across Alabama attended the Alabama AFL-CIO Convention in Montgomery. National speakers included AFL-CIO President Richard Trumka, UMWA President Cecil Roberts, and AFGE National Secretary/Treasurer Rev. Dr. Everett Kelley. They each called on the labor movement to stand up for workers and reach out to our Congressman to demand they support the PRO Act that Protects the Right to Organize and the UMWA pension bills - HR 934, HR 945, S27, and S671. Other speakers included: Randy Lawson (FMCS), Pat Keahey (G. Patterson Keahey Law), Walt Ingram (Union Sportsman), Chris Boggs (American Retirement Solutions), and John Perez (Union Auto Program).

Senator Doug Jones thanked the delegates for their support and asked they continue to do so heading into his bid for relection. He said, "You have a friend in Washington."

Governor Don Singleman debuted the movie that chronicles the people, the causes, and events surrounding his time in office and years following.

The AL AFL-CIO Executive Board were elected and several resolutions were passed; among them was one that made local labor councils presidents E-Board Members and on that called for the continued support of the United Way.


